Music is taught on a weekly basis by the Nursery Nurse		
in EYFS and included in continuous Provision.		
Music is taught on rotation with Art (usually in three		
week blocks) during PPA time by a HLTA.		
In Year 2 an HLTA teaches Recorder (using Music		
Express Recorder Magic) as part of our WCIT offer.		
In Year 4 pupils have Ukulele lessons from Leicestershire		
Music Service (ten week block).		
We have weekly singing assemblies and an Artist of the		
Week with heir songs played on entrance/exit and		
discussed in singing assembly/music lessons that week.		
Music lessons for KS1 and 2 take place in the Studio		
which has access to a range of instruments.		
There is also have access to half a class set of lpads.

We recognise that pupils with SEND who may struggle academically are often able to excel in other subjects such as Art, Music or PE. Therefore we ensure that all pupils are able to access Music lessons and are not taken out for interventions. Evey subject lead has completed an Adapted Teaching Approaches by subject which describes how we adapt/adjust music lessons according to which of the four areas of need the pupil has. The Music Express scheme covers music from a wide variety of genres and cultures. For example, China. Pupils enjoys the opportunity to use Makaton to perform songs, such as, at Christmas.
